Why The Gower?

The Gower Telford is managed by the Gower Heritage & Enterprise Foundation, under a license from Telford & Wrekin Council.

Situated in St Georges ward in North Telford, the building is intrinsically linked to the wider heritage of the area and holds fond memories for many local people who attended The Gower when it was a school and youth club.

Following years of neglect, causing the building to fall into disrepair, we are working to care for and restore this iconic building because of its historical significance, and because of what it can offer the people of St Georges and neighbouring areas.

The transformation will create an inspiring building of prestigious quality that St Georges and Telford can be proud of. It will meet the needs of local residents by creating opportunities to increase income, employment status, qualifications, skills and health.



THE STORY SO FAR

1873

Built as a cottage hospital but converted for use as a school until 1961 when it became a youth club. Closed in 2006. Earmarked for demolition. Planning permission granted for housing development.

201

Planning permission revoked and building protected following major campaign by residents to save The Gower. In 2014, the Gower Heritage & Enterprise Foundation registered with the Charity Commission as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation to take the project forward.

2014

Granted Grade II-listed status on the grounds of rarity, architectural quality, historical and sociological significance.

2015

Telford & Wrekin Council pledges £650,000 towards renovation subject to successful applications from other funders.

2016

Community engagement activities including family fundays, clean-up events, heritage group and grounds maintenance (these activities have continued since 2015).

2017

Development grants received from Telford & Wrekin Council, and Architectural Heritage Fund.

Young families and children enjoy the 80s inspired re-boot of The Gower playpark thanks to our volunteers and young people from the Prince's Trust, Juniper Training and the National Citizenship Service who learned skills and volunteered 2,000 hours to refurbish the site - amounting to £20,000 worth of labour. Telford & Wrekin Council's Pride in Your High Street provided £22,000 and local companies also contributed materials, groundwork, construction and engineering works.

INVESTMENT

St Georges requires more investment for economic and community regeneration

RAISING ASPIRATIONS

St Georges has households in the bottom 10-20% of deprivation nationally

Death from cancers, circulatory disease and heart disease are higher in St Georges compared to other wards in Telford

A quarter of the local population are long-term sick or disabled, limited provision for carers

A third of St Georges is made up of one-person households

Childhood obesity levels in St Georges are worse than the Telford and national average

Life expectancy for men is markedly lower than women in the area

Our goals

2019/21

£2.25 million raised to revive The Gower and undertake renovation works to a high architectural standard. Sign lease with Telford & Wrekin Council to place the building under community management.

The Gower opens as a multi-functional community and wellbeing hub complete with a café/ restaurant, offices, venue hire and heritage tourism creating five new jobs and 35 volunteering opportunities.

Over 20.000 centre visits recorded. 50 community organisations and special interest groups regularly use the building.

Over 1,500 tourism visitors welcomed annually as The Gower becomes an established part of the heritage tourism offer in Telford.

The Gower is self-financing through income generation activities and is home to 10 local businesses.

It will cost £2.25 million* to reopen the Gower...

- Repair and conservation work to existing building: £664,000
- Extension pods and orangery: £647,000
- Kitchen fit out and other capital equipment £42,000
- External works including roof: £259,000
- Fees and permissions: £249,500
- Risks: £142,000
- Running costs for five years: £260,000

Total costs are £2.25m of which £2m are building costs.




A place for everyone


Reopening The Gower will provide the community of St Georges with a space of their own.


We have consulted the community extensively, through open days, our website, social media and community surveys, which have generated support for the project and identified potential uses for the building.

Flexible workspace

The Gower offers six attractive offices/units suitable for local businesses, start-ups, creative enterprises and co-working for home workers and freelancers. Our offices will offer a bright and contemporary environment, with ample car parking for staff and visitors.

Each unit is approximately 215sqft. Larger units and customisation can be provided subject to early lease arrangements. Network cabling, fast broadband and telephone lines all in place for when you move in.

Café/restaurant tenancy

The Gower is seeking an experienced catering partner to operate our flagship café and restaurant enterprise, 'Fogerty's', under a profit share arrangement.

Named after the building's architect, Fogerty's is an exciting opportunity for the right tenant to make their mark and input on all aspects of the eatery - design, layout, menu and staffing.

By day, the cafe will run as a healthy homemade food establishment which will mostly cater for centre visitors, local groups, individuals and tenants. The food will be prepared on site using produce grown in the community garden where possible. A modern commercial kitchen will be large enough to service the café, a catering business for

on-site and off-site orders, and a pop-up restaurant in the evenings and weekends.

The high quality internal restoration combined with onsite catering and outdoor space, offers something truly unique and memorable.

Heritage destination

Through its architect Joseph Fogerty, who also designed the viaduct at Coalbrookdale, The Gower has close links to the Ironbridge Gorge and surrounding heritage, which attract millions of visitors each year. This close proximity enables The Gower to join the heritage trail appealing to enthusiasts, educational groups and local people who wish to explore the history of North Telford.

The Gower will create training opportunities in heritage conservation, springboard intergenerational projects and develop a variety of ways to provide a rich heritage experience linked to income streams for learning such as audio and group tours, souvenir sales, study visits, history lessons for schools and other community projects.

Our team

The Gower is a story of a community that has come together to save a piece of their heritage and have become empowered to achieve their mission.

Around 35 active trustees, volunteers and ambassadors give their time and energy to directing and developing the project on a strategic and operational basis. Many have links to the building when it was a school or youth club.

The Gower Heritage & Enterprise Foundation comprises of a **Board of Trustees** with specific skill-sets and backgrounds including a property lawyer, entrepreneur, events co-ordinator and project manager. The Board has delegated some responsibility to a **Management Group** (Gower Old School House 'GOSH' Group) who look after the day-to-day running of the project.


